Mr. Campbell's appearance at the University of Washington is made possible with support from Yamaha Corporation of America, Innovative Percussion, Evans Drumheads, L.P. (Latin Percussion Instruments), Zildjian Cymbals and the University of Washington School of Music.

GERALD KECHLEY is a Seattle-born composer and Professor Emeritus of the University of Washington School of Music, where he taught theory and composition from 1955 to 1989. He studied composition with George F. McKay and Aaron Copland, has received two Guggenheim Fellowships, several ASCAP Serious Music Awards, and a variety of other honors.

Kechley's works have been commissioned and performed by the Seattle Symphony and George Gershwin Memorial Foundation, Pacific Lutheran University Choir of the West, Wenatchee Valley Symphony Association, Northwest Chamber Chorus, St. Mary's Seminar, Baltimore, and University of Portland, among others. Publications include works for band, piano and percussion, choral works and solo songs.

Compositions include an opera, *THE GOLDEN LION*, two symphonies, works for chorus and orchestra, chamber works for piano, woodwinds, and strings, and percussion in various combinations, and a large catalog of sacred and secular choral works. All compositions have received performances throughout the United States and abroad.

Since the premiere of Second Composition for Large Orchestra by the Seattle Symphony in 1968, DAVID KECHLEY has produced 67 major works which have been performed throughout North America and Europe as well as other parts of the world. Over 800 performances have taken place including those by the Minnesota Orchestra, Cleveland Orchestra, Boston Pops, Seattle Symphony, North Carolina Symphony, Colorado Symphony, St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, Kronos Quartet, Lark Quartet, and the United States Military Academy Band.

Kechley has twice received grants from the National Endowment for the Arts and in 1979 was awarded a Fellowship by the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation. His Five Ancient Lyrics on Poems by Sappho was first prize winner of the 1980-81 Shreveport Symphony Composers' Competition and Concerto for Violin and Strings won the 1979 Opus I Chamber Orchestra Contest for Ohio Composers. In the Dragon's Garden was a winner of the 1994 Lee Ettelson Prize and two orchestral works, *Lightning Images* and *TRANSFORMATIONS: An Orchestral Triptych* received honorable mentions in the 1994 and 1998 ASCAP Nissim Competitions.

David Kechley was born in Seattle where he received a Bachelors Degree in 1970 and Masters in 1974 from the University of Washington. He completed a Doctorate in Composition at the Cleveland Institute of Music in 1979. He is currently Professor of Music and Chair of the Department at Williams College in Williamstown, MA.
