CLASSICAL

CAMERON BENNETT, Dean of the School of Arts and Communication at Pacific Lutheran University, received his Masters and Doctorate degrees in piano performance from the Manhattan School of Music. He also holds degrees from the University of Western Ontario and the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto, Canada. Bennett has performed as a soloist and chamber musician throughout the United States, Canada, Russia and the Far East. He is a founding member of the Marble Cliff Chamber Players in Columbus, Ohio and performs regularly with the Snake River Chamber Players in Keystone, Colorado. He served for many seasons as a chamber music performer and coach at the Victoria International Festival in Victoria, Canada, and as staff accompanist at The Juilliard School. He has taught previously at the Brooklyn Conservatory of Music and has given master classes at the Beijing Central Conservatory, Shanghai Conservatory, and the Chinese Cultural University in Taipei, Taiwan. He continues to be in great demand as a collaborating pianist.

A new resident of Seattle, MERRIE SIEGEL is Principal Flute of the Northwest Symphony Orchestra and Adjunct Faculty (music theory) at the University of Puget Sound School of Music. Her CD, Flute Music of the Americas, was hailed as "stunning" by the American Record Guide; her next album of Latin American pieces will be released shortly on Albany Records. She has held the position of Principal Flute with the Boise Philharmonic, Orquesta Sinfonica de Aguascalientes, Orquesta Sinfonica de la Universidad Autonoma de Nuevo Leon, and the Filarmonica del Bajio (Mexico). In addition, Merrie has performed with the Houston Symphony, Charleston Symphony, Spokane Symphony and the Rochester Philharmonic. She has been a member of the faculties of the University of Idaho, Houston Community College, Universidad Autonoma de Nuevo Leon, Escuela Superior de Musica y Dana and Conservatorio de las Rosas. She received her Bachelor's degree from the Eastman School of Music as a student of Bonita Boyd, and her Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from the Shepherd School of Music at Rice University as a student of Leone Buyse, Walfrid Kujala, and Anne Diener Zentner

Renowned as a soloist, chamber player, and teacher, cellist CORDELIA WIKARSKI-MIEDEL taught at the University of Puget Sound from 1979 to 2010. During those years, she also headed the UPS chamber music program, and gave workshops and master classes throughout the Northwest. Professor Wikarski-Miedel has been a contributor to Strad Magazine, and she is the producer of the annual Seattle Violoncello Society Bach Marathon, in which the Northwest's finest cellists convene to play movements from the six Bach Suites for Unaccompanied Cello. She also is known throughout the region as an adjudicator and coach. Born in Berlin, Wikarski-Miedel has won prizes at the Munich Duo Competition, the International Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow, and the Pablo Casals Competition in Budapest. As a concert artist, she has toured from Europe and Scandinavia to Russia, India and Iraq. She has resided in Seattle since 1977.
