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Jan 7th. went to church--- the streets are very muddy and dirty also swampy in some places

Jan. 8th.--- the cholera has broken out afresh at the village of Howedir up the Diala about 10 days ago and carried about 20 people for about a week and then it ceased completely. A cordon has been established between Howedir and Bakuba , but there is nothing now, at Kermanshah there are still few cases.

Jan. 9th. At 9.30 the S.S.Khalifah arrived. Showket Bey, son of Rafat Bey, Kamakam of Coot and his family 3 women came up on the Khalifah he has been shifted to Hilla as Kaimakam as Hilla had a Motserrif until now, but this function has been shifted to Diwanyeh instead as it was formerly which place is more in the centre of the business and more important although much smaller.

Jan 10th. Baghdad to Basreh.

At 6 am underweigh - 3 in 1st Class being H Rafat Effendi my friend who was in the Police department as first clerk of the census, and now being appointed as member of the Mejlis for the Sultan's Domain at Amara the other is H. Nejib Beg a Colonel in the Turkish service and the third is the sister of Agha Mahomed Jewad Kazrooni who died at Bushire and was the agent of the Persian steamers of Bombay.

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Jan. 19th. Very cold and freezing weather

Jan 23rd. Baghdad to Basreh. At 5.45 am proceeded.

Jan 24th. At 11.45 arrived at Coot. Abbass Kooli Khan Pheily the former Governor of the Lohristan Hill over the Koords has arrived here from Tehran by himself on his way to Kerballa to the pilgrimage, The Koords here want me to go to see him he was a great friend of my father since 35 years then he was overthrown and succeeded by Hussein Kooli Khan (the present governor) when the latter marched against him and took possession of the hills by force in 1855/6, then my brother Thomas was with him and he was plundered of everything he possessed. I have never seen Abbass Khan before for I was then in Bombay when he visited Baghdad in 1856. So I went to see him here he looks very old now, he must have over 65 years he looks very miserable and poor, the Koords have great regard and love for him because he is not so tyrant and severe as Hussein Kooli Khan. He is going to Kerballa overland and will then return to Baghdad he asked me to get him some Tea from Basreh, he came from Tehran in 12 days to Shahraban on horseback.

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it is about five months since it was begun

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Jan 30th. At 9 am called to see Menusha and sister Emilia, the latter has been robbed of her clothes from her box in her room upstairs on Wednesday last in the afternoon, some one came in the house and went up to her room and took only the clothes worth over 100 Beshlics.

Jan 31st. At 2 pm called on sister Eliza and Medula and then went with Grzesiki and called on Dowd Ghazala the Photographer who has arrived from his travels to Chicago and Paris a fortnight ago but he did not succeed at all with his photographs.

FEBRUARY 1st. -- We are invited to go to Antone Sayegh's house for the marriage of Shekoory Sayegh tonight with Takooyi the daughter of Eassayi son of Elias Bassa---- At 12 the marriage ceremony took place performed by the American priest Philippus and soon after I left and came home, left there Eliza and Alexander who came afterward.

Feb 2nd. -- My wife and Alexander went to Shekoory Sayegh's where they are invited the whole day and night as today they will send over the Jehaz or the Bride's kit-- I called on Alice and sister Emilia at 4 pm. Alice came with me we went to sister Medula to see the Jehaz pass from the home of Eassay to Shekoory Sayegh's house--- Eliza came home at 9½ pm.

Feb 4th. A Baghdad to Basreh. At 6 am proceeded.

In 1st class Mr and Mrs. Newton of the Imperial Bank of Persia leaving Baghdad for good, his wife is an Armenian of Bushire.

Feb. 5th. At 0.50 pm passed Memlah. At 4.45 pm passed the S.S.Khalifah going up I saw Edward the son of Blockey and my poor sister Carolina, he is 17 years old he came out in the 'Shat el Arab' Blockey wants to put him in his office, he did not want Berty (Albert) here and sent him away because he was getting too much a Catholic and he blames my sister Emilia and her daughter Alice for having made a good Christian

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of him which he was bound to keep to his promise when he was married and gave written paper from his hand to the french priests, and soon after my sister's death he took his children out of the Catholic school and put them in the Protestants.

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In 1st class a Persian called Mirza Allah Khan going to Ali Gherbi and thence he is going to Hussein Khuli Khan the Governor of Lohristan on the hills and thence he goes to Tehran by that way, he has travelled a good deal in Europe, Russia, India, Burma China and Turkey

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Feb 25th At 0.20 am landed the mails at the Residency . --- Weather very fine and cold River is still rising.

Feb. 26th. I wrote a letter to Mr. Bolm in Vienna by today's Post for Constple. I asked him to get my passport renewed which will be finished in August next, and will send it to him to get it done for me

Feb 27th. The river had risen very much there are only about 5 feet left to reach its heighest rise, the bridge is cut open and current very strong --- Mr. Bottomley has written to us to take the Rupee at 24 Piastres instead of 25, as it fell since we were away from 26 to

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Piastres, and in future we are to take the Turkish Lira @ 404 instead 390 R.Piastres.

MARCH 1ST. Fine clear and cold weather, the river has fallen about 10 bricks, they are putting the bridge across

March 2nd. It begun to rain at about 2 or 3 am and kept it on without ceasing all the day, the house got swampy the streets very wet, I could not leave the house from the continual rain

March 4th. Baghdad to Basreh At 5 am proceeded.-- In 1st Class, Abdulla Wahby Beg Mudir of the Regie and a custom house head clerk for Basreh who got a free passage by S.Lynch and Co -- We have the Halai Beghy and Taboor Aghassy and about 8 followers going down to Ctesiphon all free for an excursion

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8th. My stomach is again troubling me with the pain I used to get before, I have not had such a pain since I went to Europe in 1891 I suffer the constipation and cutting pain in the stomach and intestines I am taking Rhubarb also Bicarbonate of Soda and Eno's fruit salt, but none has done me any good, I feel very bilious and am inclined to vomit

March 11th. At 6.30 landed mails at the Residency and went up to the custom house The Mahomedan fasting of Ramadan began here on thursday the 8th. I went home and found the streets very muddy, they have had very abrd showers of rain yesterday with hails and thunder the whole day

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March 16th. The Turkish steamers have got lots of cargo for shipment at Basreh brought up by the mail steamers and 'Bona' Asfars steamer; they are now getting more cargo than what we get at a cheaper rate. At 10 went on shore and then took the Jew broker and went to see the house of H Abdulrahman Pachachy who wants to mortgage it with the Messauya garden for 1000 liras for two years, it is a fine house, H. Abdulrahman took me over and showed me the rooms-- came home I saw Dr Sutton on the way and asked him to call and see Alexander who has still little fever, Blockey and his son Edward called on us to introduce his son for the first time

March 17th. At 7 am I called on Abduljebbar Effendi about the house of H. Abdulrahman Pacahachy I wished to take it, but I see the difficulty of getting my money back from such a person noted for his intrigues and offered 800 liras and to have the house for at least 4 years

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March 25th. Easter Sunday.

Very cloudy and dark At 3 am proceeded from Gusseiba. At 5.35 passed through the Bridge of Gherrarah, sent a deckman to Baghdad At 8 landed mails at the Residency and steamed up to the Custom House ---- I went home --- I called on the Chaldean Bishop and the other Priests of the four churches here, also on Catherina Yagchi saw her son Michail who came up last time in the Khalifah called on Asfars Antone Marine, sisters Eliza, Medula and Emilia, some people called on us I am suffering awfully from my stomach the pain is continual

March 26th Rain and made the streets very muddy and dirty and had to stop at home

March 29th. An Italian tourist arrived here the day before by Kelek from Constple via Aleppo, Deir and Mossul is called Leone Gaitani Principe di Teano a distinguished young gentleman and is leaving for Persia he is living now in the English Residency.

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The Bridge is cut open this morning and news came yesterday that a great rise of the river is coming down, it is now rising rapidly it rose 1 foot since this morning that is about 3 hours.

Lots of people wanting 1st class cabins, I had asked Mr. Bottomley the day before yesterday for a passage for my wife to Basreh which he gave Yesterday Artin son of Abdulla Malcolm (who is clerk in one of the B.I steamers obtained tickets for his sister Mrs. Culbert in 1st class free and for himself and his wife also in 1st class, and paying only Deck fare.-- I reserved the other cabin for Mr. Blunson clerk of Mr. Livingstone, at noon yesterday, Mr. Bottomley writes to me to reserve a 1st class cabin for Naji Effendi the head of the Mejlis el Beolaya-- Today when I was in the office I heard that Mr. Hodgson the mission ary was there and had taken a ticket for 1st class, as Capt. Cowley was there, I spoke to him as to what am I to do with cabins as there are none left, he told me that Artin Malcolm should go to a 2nd class with his wife as he pays only deck and messes with the engineers and keep his cabin for Mr. Hodgson, and he told Hamad to go and tell him so he went to him and he objected by saying that he took that cabin yesterday, and he is going at once to Mr. Bottomley to see about it At 3 pm when I had gone on board and while I was very busy copying the cargo from the officers, Mr. Bottomley sent for me with the boy to say that he wanted to see me in the office immediately I went to him, he asked me what Mr. Artin wanted and he told him that he has been refused a cabin aft. I explained all to him and told him that Capt. Cowley had sent to tell him so, he said that Capt. Cowley cannot interfere with orders sent from office; he told that since Taylor had given him a passage up in 1st class and paying deck, he is doing the same, as he would not have done if it had not been so, and asked me to make some arrangements by giving my wife a single cabin and let my son sleep in my cabin with

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me and since Mr. Blunson has not yet taken the cabin it cannot be reserved for him; I told him that I asked you for a passage for my wife it is only once a year that she goes down with me, he said that he is agreeable that she should have a cabin for herself but I did not ask him for my son, so he said to me to make the best I can, and that Artin and his wife should have cabin aft, I came on board, I was sorry for having gone to the office to Bottomley for such a miserable man to go and complain against me, which is due to Capt. Cowley's order for sending Hamad to tell him. If it had not been for my wife going down with me this time, I would not have acted otherwise even if I had to resign the service; The state of Lynch's administration is going from bad to worse very rapidly, and as I know that Bottomley is going to leave the service very soon after the arrival of Mr. Clarke, because some time ago he asked Lynch in London to let him have six months leave, and they declined giving him for the present, so he tendered his resignation, they accepted it.

March 31st. 30th. At 7½ am came on board to pay the ship's wages for this month. The river is very high and still rising with heavy swell, it has attained its high standard, there are five bricks left to the very top of the bank, or two steps more to flood the Custom House

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At 6.45 we weighed and proceeded

At 2 10 pm passed Azizieh, At 5,30 we rounded and came to for the Khalifah which anchored below Sheresh, Capt. Cowley and myself went on board saw Mr. Clarke who came out in the Gorgi from England after his leave, he has been away nearly 8 or 9 months--- At 9.50 arrived at Coot. The river is very high here in some places it has overflowed April 3rd. At 11.30 am passed Gorna, I threw off a telegram in a bottle for Rufail at Basreh, telling him that his mother was on board, I could not send one from Baghdad or Amara as the line is broken At 3.30 pm arrived at Basreh.

April 5th.-- We shipped 8 horses belonging to Saad el Moolk the ex-Governor of Bushire who is dismissed and is going up with us to Baghdad and thence to Tehran---- The steamer of Sheikh Mezel the "Iran" came up at 1 pm also the steam launch Nasry of Mezel too, and brought up the former Governor of Bushire Saad el Mulk Basreh to Baghdad. At 4.40 pm got underweigh

April 6th. At 5.15 pm arrived at Amara ---- I heard here that the river broke in above Baghdad and the water has surrounded the town

April 8th.-- At 9 35 am arrived at Coot-- Abbass Khan Fheily (former governor of Lohristan) came on board to go up to Baghdad, he took a Deck passage with one servant only he was at Kerballa and came back here few days ago then went to Ali Gherbi and came back here , he is wandering about and no one knows the object of it. -- Abbass Khan is travelling very miserably, he had no money to pay his passage and that of a servant the Koords had to pay for him at Coot, he has no baggage

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April 9th. Abbass Khan Fhely pays me frequent visits to my cabin and talks of the old time and of my father 40 years ago

April 10th. At 2.30 am landed Abbass Khan At 5.30 passed Diala river, the desert is all flooded from Diala and upward toward Baghdad, but the gardens are saved --- At 9 40 landed a deckman at Gherara at 9.40 went alongside the bank at Mariam bint Omran and landed the horses belonging to Saad Moolk and left at 10 -- He gave Capt. Cowley a cashmere shawl and some money to the servants they wanted to give me 50 Kerquis, but I declined it, so they are going to send me a small carpet instead. At 10.20 landed mails at the Residency and steamed up to the Custom House, I went on shore to my house found the Indian watchman Haj Tai el Din---- People of the town are busy outside making Sudds round the town

April 12th. I heard the sad news of the death of Sebrak son of Michail Minas last night so suddenly it must be from appoplexy, he was complaining of earache for few days he is young yet of about 45 years, but was stout and had a short neck, he used to drink to excess too, he was lately employed at the Ottoman Bank.

April 13th. Called on Yacoob Pehlewan our neighbour to congratulate them on the marriage of their daughter with Naoomy son of Bahoshy a clerk in Lynch's office which took place on Sunday last-----

Setrak Michail was buried yesterday evening in the Armenian Orthodox Church near my house, as the Armenian cemetery outside the North Gate is all swamped with water, the authorities did not give much trouble about it.

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April 15th. Baghdad to Basreh.

Ship is very light , very little freight. At 7 am passed Diala At 8 passed Ctesiphon there is a great mass of water on the west bank at Seleucia, the mounds are only above water, it is a regular sea, it must have come from the Euphrates. The Barool Khana (or Salt Peter factory is falling down and is deserted, its walls are in the water from the river so high that they are simply melting down, but the swamp does not extend along the bank but it is far into the desert

April 16th. At 5.40 pm arrived at Amara We left at 6.30, took 14 passengers, (Mons Joragroi a french civil engineer for the Sennyeh property who was in Baghdad for the last two years came on board to go down with us to Basreh and an other Turkish military Engineer both took 1st clas)

April 17th. At 6. 25 am landed 3½ passengers at Kalat Saleh and took one and went on The river here is quite full some parts are innundated not so bad as above Amara and the cause is that more than half of it goes to the Hud canal which has become so large and broad for the last few years that it is absorbing two thirds of the river and if left so, the river below Amara will be un-navigable and will dry up, even now with this high rise there three draaz (4½ feet) in some places. I pointed out to M Jacqroi and showed him the Elbow too, how narrow and intricate is getting. There is nos trong current at all running down in this part of the river below Amara.

Saw Eliza, Alexander and Tookyeh in passing Rufail's place, at 4 pm anchored at Basreh

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Received the mails at 10 pm and at 10.10 got under weigh

April 20th. Effie my niece (Mrs. Milne) going for a change to Baghdad with her little newly born son and a servant free, Mr Johnston employed in the Tobacco Monopoly Mr. J Grumberg going to join the Ottoman Bank, and Revd. Mr. Contine Missionary of Basreh all paying

April 22nd. At 9.20 am passed Memlah Shedeif along the East bank is all inundated the water is gone so far that no land can be seen even with the glass in some places . At 3 pm passed the S.S.Khalifah came down She stopped at Shedeif and her boat came off with Mr. Bedford the superintendent of Post Offices for his letters Henry writes to me that they left at 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ am and left the river still rising, all the desert around the town is flooded from both rivers the Euphrates too all the cultivations are destroyed and it is expected to rise still more. --- Ma Mere Euxuperie is on board going to France by the Arabistan Mr. and Mrs Bedford free, that Nawb Dastaghir Khan and 6 Persians family of Agha Khan in 1st class.

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Tigris The desert from Diala and up to Baghdad as far as the eye can see is one mass of sea only the mound of Blegha is visible in the middle, the Rostomyeh and Dedleavyeh all innundate the Poplar groves under water the mud houses are falling down all the Arab villages on the banks are swamped and deserted

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April 26th.--- At 10 I called on Blockey in his new Khan at Ras el Gheryeh he has hired for 70 T Liras a year

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April 28th. We have Mr. and Mrs Bottomley the head clerk of Lynch's office going to London, he has resigned because Lynch in London would not give him leave of absence to go to England after 6 years service, also Alfred Holland has got 6 months leave to go to England and Mr. Andrews of Darby Andrews & Co. this house has been abolished here and their agency is given over to Mr. Livingstone the agent of Dawd Sasson

April 29th.--- Beatrice the eldest daughter of Captain Cowley is also going with her Uncle Alfred to see England and will return with him it is a very good chance and opportunity for her

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May 5th. While rounding round the reach on the top of Shersh at 6 pm the ship got into the eddy and swung round five times before she was put straight ahead and steamed up close along the East bank and got clear

May 6th. At 7.50 am passed Azizieh the village is surrounded with water. and suds are made around it and is isolated the water is deep around it and ramming in from above the village as far as the eye can see the river is rising it seems if not worse than before. At 11.50 passed Baghdadieh Fort, went through the island, the country is flooded about Hiaje all the desert is one mass of water- sea

At 8 pm we anchored above Bostan at Steh for the night, fearing the high rise and swampy banks ahead of us

May 7th. At 8.45 passed Diala river, the desert from this river and up to Baghdad is still under water like one mass of sea nothing to be seen except pieces of embankments along the river left standing

At 1 pm landed the mails. and then to the Custom House, the bridge is across the river, but the river is higher than when we left by one brick, it is now only 3 bricks below its very top---- I called at 4 pm on Catterina Yagchi as her son the younger one Gabriel is leaving this evening for Mossul to go there to study spiritual lessons for an ecclesiastical career at his uncles Pere Augustine

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May 9th. some people called also Bedry Bey who was out at Abco Habba with Pere Chail digging and found good many Tablets and Coffins

May 11th.--- called on Menusha and came home, found Pere Marie Joseph he recommended me to take instead of tea, the Violet flower at breakfast always for my stomach, which I did --- I took a warm bath At 5 pm I called on Bedry Bey, he showed me the photographs of Abco Habba (Zippana anciently) after excavations they made and of the Terra Cotta figures and the Tombs they found, they are built of bricks the vaults are arched and the coffin in baked terra cotta were laid inside, the bones and skeletons are also found there, they have found 470 good and entire tablets and over 300 partly broken ones, at 6 I came home.

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At 4.35 am got underweigh At 7.15 rounded and came to at Ctesiphon and landed the Indians about 150 of them had made arrangement with Mr. Clarke to land them for 100 Rupees and await 2½ hours until they visit the Tomb. Saleh Agha the Mudir of Ctesiphon came on board he is my friend I gave him a bottle of snuff, he is going down with us to Azizieh

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May 16th. At 7 am came on board found our ship crowded with passengers all the deck is full with Persian and Arab pilgrims, the cabins are all taken by Indians--- people are fighting for places. We have put some on the quarter deck by paying double deck fare

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May 17th. One German traveller who comes from Damascus by the desert passing to the Sheikh Ibn Rashid of Shammar el jebel his name is Hermann Burchardt

May 19th. -- At 10.20 am passed Memlah The river is just as high as before it has not fallen a bit below the bank so as to allow the water draining into it from the desert the whole of the Eastern bank along Shedeif reach is one mass of sea extending far inland coming from broken canal

May 20th. At 4.50 pm landed mails at the Residency and steamed up to the Custom House

May 22nd. I sent money to the office--- at the Custom House the money was stopped from passing as the Rupees are prohibited its importation and had to send to the Mudir and got a permission to pass although there were few Rupees, the Kerans too are not allowed to be imported

May 24th. Holy day of Corpus Domini and the Queen of England's birthday--- I did not go to the Levee held by the Resident Colonel Mockler from 8 till 10 am.

May 27th. Baghdad to Basreh

At 6.50 am got underway --- we were detained for Dr. and Mrs Sutton and Miss Cristleib Mrs Sutton's sister and his two young children, and Dr. Baker the Residency surgeon who are going down to Basreh thence to Kurachi.

May 29th. At 2.45 pm arrived at Basreh --- Lots of applications

At 3 pm landed at Basreh

May 16th. At 7 am came on board found our ship crowded with passengers all the deck is full with Persian and Arab pilgrims, the cabins are all taken by Indians--- people are fighting for places. We have put some on the quarter deck by paying double deck fare

Basreh to Baghdad. At 5. 30 pm got under weigh

May 17th. One German traveller who comes from Damascus by the desert passing to the Sheikh Ibn Rashid of Shammar el jebel his name is Hermann Burchardt

May 19th. -- At 10.20 am passed Memlah The river is just as high as before it has not fallen a bit below the bank so as to allow the water draining into it from the desert the whole of the Eastern bank along Shedeif reach is one mass of sea extending far inland coming from broken canal

May 20th. At 4.50 pm landed mails at the Residency and steamed up to the Custom House

May 22nd. I sent money to the office--- at the Custom House the money was stopped from passing as the Rupees are prohibited its importation and had to send to the Mudir and got a permission to pass although there were few Rupees, the Kerans too are not allowed to be imported

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May 29th. At 2.45 pm arrived at Basreh --- Lots of applications

for cabins again as before. Persians Arabs and Indians ---
 at Jeboory Asfar, I saw Mons de Sarzec and his wife who have come down
 from Tellow yesterday evening in a sailing boat in 2½ days though the
 canal called El Arna and out to Hamar on the Euphrates, he is very
 satisfied with his excavations this time, I do not know if he has been
 able to take any ex antiquities with him this time or given all
 over to the Turkish authorities he will have a long stay here waiting
 for Asfar's steamer

May 30th. Dr. Sutton is going back with us, and Dr. Baker has got his
 leave to go to England today by a telegram.

Basreh to Baghdad. At 8 pm got underweigh , awfully warm, it is
 very dampy and the air is loaded with moisture.

JUNE 1ST. At 5. 10 am passed Ali Gherbi Gave tickets to 47 Amara
 passengers, besides the sister of Rustum Effendi Mudir of Custom House
 of Amara free by Capt. Cowley , she is going with her sister in Ist
 class from Basreh with H. Ibrahim son of Abdulwahed Mubarek.

June 3rd. At 9½ pm landed mails at the Residency, Tookyeh myself and serv
 ant Hamad got into a goffa and crossed over and came home, all well,
 they knew of Tookyeh's coming from Rufail's telegram.

June 4th. Went to the office for some money, as we are paying for
 this month only Rupees at 24 Piastres as it worth in the bazaar

June 8th. I received a letter from my brother Alexander, from Constple
 he is living at Tepeh Bashi at Pera in the same quarter where I was
 living

June 9th. Since yesterday morning the Persian pilgrims are coming in
 they have passed across the bridge of Moadem to Kadimain and then
 they come to Baghdad, pass over the bridge and through the town to
 Diala thence to Ctesiphon and ferry across in boats to Hirryeh and
 they take the road toward Musseyeb to Kerbellah and Meshed, they
 hav e to avoid the large mass of water that still exists between
 Baghdad and the Euphrates. , their number exceed 5,000 I am told

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June 10th. Baghdad to Basreh

At 4.15 am left Baghdad. At 5.5 passed Ctesiphon, the first sand-bank island appeared opposite Ctesiphon. There is still a large mass of water in the desert at Seleucia, it is draining into the river and is getting much less. At 7.30 we stopped at Seyafyeh below Ctesiphon and landed 10 persons free being the family of H. Mehdi Shekerchi, both banks are crowded with Persian pilgrims ferrying across in sailing boats and two steam launches and many goffas, but the majority are still by the East bank, the Persian consul and some zapyehs are also here superintending, they offered us a keran to each person if we crossed them over in the Mejidieh, there are about 2000 of them, Cowley declined.--- At 10.50 passed the Khalifah at Sivera going up, Effie my niece and Mr. Milne going up for a change, they have lost their little son few days ago (on last thursday week) he died from starvation and nursing.

June 12th. At 4.10 pm arrived at Basreh. -- Mr. de Sarzec has left this few days ago, the french steamer, the "esther" Capt. Chapice took him and his wife down to Bushire to join the Scarsdale thence to Marseilles, he took with him about 10 cases containing some of the best antiquities he had discovered at Tello such as statues and pottery slabs etc. all inscribed, they say here that two boats load of slabs of terracotta tablets etc were laden and brought down here and consigned to the Turkish govt. (He had certainly picked the best pieces for the french museum)

June 13th. At 3 pm the S.S. Malamir arrived from the Karoon, we got few passengers from her--- Bedry Bey who came down by way of Killeh and Divanyeh he will go to Constple with the anti quities of of Abou Habba and Tello (of de Sarzec)

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June 14th. At 1.30 am anchored on account of the country being flooded and banks not visible

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June 19th. I called on Mons. Achille he is very weak and sinking, Dr. Sutton is attending him, he is very old, born 1814. I went to call on M. Pognon the french consul I showed him my Passport which I obtained in Vienna in August 1891 and as I am going to send it to M. Bohm to get it changed for me I asked him whether it is requisite to have it vised or registered before sending it, he told me it was not required that I can send it as it is and if I wish it so I shall have to pay a fee of 10 francs, which will be a saving to me

June 20th --- There are lots of fever in Baghdad, among the Arabs and the low class people the opposite side of the town, the Kerrada, Moaddem, Kadumain, in the town itself the fever is raging, all this is the cause of the large quantity of water that is innundated by the desert this year.

June 24th. Baghdad to Basreh (voyage 282) At 4. 15 am got underweigh

June 26th At 4, 10 pm arrived at Basreh, there is lots of cargo for us

June 27th. I went to the consulate to the Post Office and posted a letter for Mr. Bohm in Vienna enclosing my Austrian passport and registered it and paid 8 annas

June 28th. Jaboory Asfar's wife, and his two children and 3 servants and a cow and lots of kit are going up with us free

Basreh to Baghdad. At 4.30 pm left Basreh

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JULY 2ND. At 3.40 pm landed the mails at the Residency, we observed all the consulates flagstaffs half masted and on enquiry heard that President Carnot of the french republic was killed by an anarchist

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about 6 days ago

July 4th. At about 9 pm as Eliza was going on top of the house she put her hand on the parapet on the terrace and was stung by a scorpion so violent that she felt the pain very severely, I rubbed it with spirits of ammonia, also laudamine but the pain was very little allayed, she cannot sleep all night.

July 5th. At 5 pm called on Dr. Sundberg the american consul by appointment and explained to him my complaint of my stomach evrything from its beginning, he advised me to take a glass of hot water in the morning as soon as I get out of bed, and gave me 7 packets of powder to take one at each meal before sitting at table, and to eat nourishing and digesting food etc. and on Saturday evening to call on him and tell him what result it made so as to change the medicine.

July 6th.--- I called on the Chaldaean Bishop Michail, he had just received a telegram from the Chaldean Bishop af Diarbekir Abed Isho in wh which he informs him of his being invested with the Patrirchate in place of the Chaldean Patriarch Elija who died at Mossul about a fortnight ago

July 7th. Today is the birthday of my son Alexander he has just completed sixteen years born in 1878--- At 6 pm I called on Dr. Sundberg, I told him that the medicine did not do me much good--He gave me about 20 cards of some other medicine to take 3 tomes a day and to vontinue taking a glass of hot water every morning when I get out of bed.

July 8th. Baghdad to Basreh. At 4.20 am got underway

July 10th. At 4.10 pm arrived at Basreh

July 11th. My tents 2 in No.1 which I have written to Bombay to my friend Adamjee Peerbhay to send me have arrived by the Simala of last week's mail and they are in the Custom House Basreh to Baghdad. At 5.45 pm got underway.
