DAVE ROSS joined Newsradio 710 KIRO in 1978, and became host of *THE DAVE ROSS SHOW* in 1987. He covered the fall of the Berlin Wall and the revolution in Czechoslovakia in 1989, and the fall of the Communist Party in Moscow in 1991. In 1992, he broadcast from Los Angeles in the aftermath of the Rodney King riots. In September 2001, Ross covered New York City's recovery from the 9/11 attacks, and he broadcast from Jerusalem in April 2002 during Colin Powell's visit. His reporting career has also taken him to China, Turkey, Jordan, Japan, and Argentina.

Ross does a daily commentary for the CBS Radio Network, and substitutes for Charles Osgood. He also writes and produces *CHIP TALK*, a syndicated feature about computers that is aired on some 200 radio stations across the country.

He is a 1973 graduate of Cornell University and began his full-time career as a reporter for WSB Radio in Atlanta.

Ross has appeared for 23 seasons with the Seattle Gilbert and Sullivan Society.
