Tom Collier has been a member of the University of Washington School of Music faculty since 1980. He is a respected performer with extensive credits in several areas including jazz, rock, popular and classical music. He has recorded several albums with his own groups including the 1981 Inner City Records release "Whistling Midgets" featuring tonight's electric bassist, Dan Dean. In 1980, Collier received an "Outstanding Service To Jazz Education Award" from the National Association of Jazz Educators National Convention. As a side musician, he has recorded with a variety of jazz and popular artists including Earl "Fatha" Hines, Roger Kellaway, Shelly Manne, Bill Smith, Howard Roberts, Ernie Watts, Ry Cooder, and Emil Richards.

Dan Dean is an outstanding electric bassist, composer, and arranger. He has won many awards as a recording artist/producer for various commercial and film projects in conjunction with his company Dan Dean Productions. As a performer, Dean has recorded and performed with many important jazz artists including Howard Roberts, Ernie Watts, Diane Schurr, Dave Grusin, Buddy DeFranco, Shelly Manne, Ernestine Anderson, and many others. He has written and produced several electric bass method books for Hal Leonard Publishing Company and, along with Tom Collier, received an Outstanding Service To Jazz Education Award in 1981 from the National Association of Jazz Educators National Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Steve Korn is a versatile drummer/percussionist who has worked with many artists of local and international fame including Marc Seales, Bill Smith, Floyd Standifer, Jon Faddis, Pete Christlieb, David Samuels, Rick Mandyke, and Buddy Catlett. He can be heard supporting bassist Ted Kamp on his recent CD "Dedications" on the POMO label. Korn has also published various articles on jazz drumming in *MODERN DRUMMER MAGAZINE* and other publications.
