Biographies

MELINDA JOHNSON, a native Seattleite, has studied flute for ten years and is currently studying with Felix Skowronek. She is a freshman scholarship winner at the University of Washington and plans to pursue a career in flute performance. Melinda is a member of the Seattle Youth Symphony and the Seattle Flute Society.

JESSICA STEVENS, formerly on the piano faculty at Scripps College, is presently in the doctoral program in piano performance at the University of Washington. She was a staff assistant in accompanying at the University for two years. Piano studies have been with Béla Siki and Alberto Ráfols. She holds a Master of Music degree in Performance Practice from Stanford University where she did extensive chamber music studies with the Francesco Trio. Undergraduate studies were at the Cleveland Institute of Music, Baldwin-Wallace College Conservatory of Music and Scripps College

LIBBY SANDUSKY is a native of Seattle. Her main teachers have been Larey McDaniel, Leon Russianoff, and William McColl. She has a B.A. in Music from Washington State University and has studied for one year at Manhattan School of Music in New York. She is presently working on a combined Music Education/Performance Masters degree at the University of Washington. Libby has toured Europe with America's Youth in Concert Orchestra, performed with the Chautauqua Orchestra in New York, and the Robert Marcellus Master Class. She teaches and performs in the Seattle area.

GARY BUSCH, who received his Bachelor and Master degrees from the University of Washington, has been in residence on scholarship at the Banff Centre for the Arts this year. He has been awarded a doctoral teaching assistantship at the Manhattan School of Music in New York City where he will study with Arthur Balsam this fall.

STEPHEN DANIELS completed his Bachelor's degree in violin performance as a student of Denes Zsigmondy at the University of Washington. He then continued his musical studies at the Academy of Music in Vienna, Austria as a student of Edward Melkus. He was a winner in the Battelle Young Artists' series and this past year winner of the second prize in the concerto competition at Marylhurst, Oregon. He was also a member of the Tonkünstler Orchestra in Vienna and has performed as a soloist on Austrian Radio. Presently, he is working on a Master of Music degree under Denes Zsigmondy.
