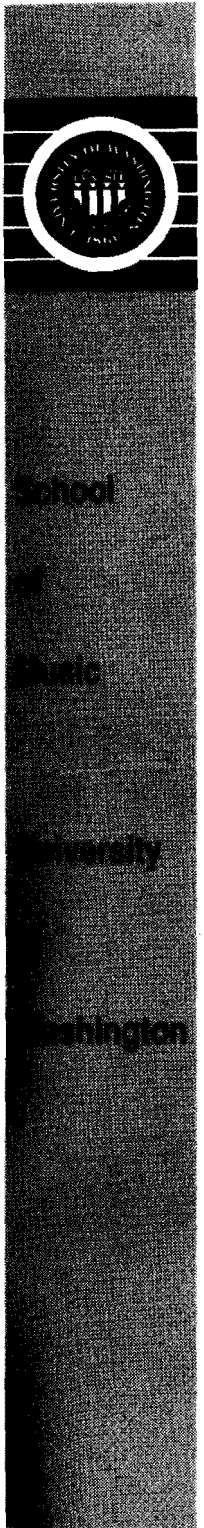

KENNY G, celebrated jazz saxophonist and University of Washington alumnus, returns to the stage of Meany Hall where he performed many concerts as a member of the Studio Jazz Ensemble. Today he excites audiences around the world with the same authenticity and daring he has always expressed through his playing.
