Born in Seoul, Korea, JIN-HWA CHON began playing the piano at the age of seven before coming to the United States in 1977. A graduate of the Eastman School of Music and Indiana University, where she received her B.Mus. and M.Mus. degrees, respectively, her teachers have included Rebecca Penneys and Enrica-Cavallo Gulli. Jin-Hwa is currently studying with Craig Sheppard at the University of Washington, where she is pursuing a Doctor of Musical Arts degree. In addition to teaching various ages and levels at the Music Center of the Northwest, she holds a teaching assistanship to the Piano Department at the University of Washington.
