

MONTHLY MINE & UXO ACCIDENT REPORT

MAY 1996

SIEM REAP PROVINCE

In May 1996, 54 people were injured by mines and UXO. This figure includes 13 children (24 %). A total of 7 persons (or 13 %) of the 54 people injured died as a result of their injuries. This month 44 % of the total number of casualties were soldiers, 56 % were civilians (4 % of whom were adult civilian females).

10 soldiers injured in Preah Vihear province were registered at the Siem Reap hospital. These soldiers have not been included in the 54 casualties.

One soldier was injured while demining and another soldier was injured in the explosion (Kan Tou commune). One soldier was killed by a mine while patrolling in an unknown mined area in Chum Ksan commune, one soldier was killed while demining and 6 soldiers were injured in a mine explosion in Romany commune.

Details of the 13 children injured are as follows:

- In Chong Kal district, 10 children were injured by mines: 1 girl was killed, 5 boys and 2 girls were injured by a mine explosion in Cheung Tean commune while a soldier was moving a mine. One boy and 1 girl were injured by a mine explosion in Pongro commune when a dog pulled a trip wire.
- In Angkor Thom district, 3 children were injured by mines: 1 girl was injured by a mine while traveling in an unknown mined area and another girl was injured in the explosion in Chub Tatrav commune, 1 boy was injured while playing with an item of UXO in Leang Dai commune .

This month the majority of accidents took place in Chong Kal district:

In Chong Kal district, 18 people were injured by mines (including 10 children). 3 of the 18 casualties were soldiers: 1 soldier was killed while moving a mine, 1 soldier was injured while demining and another one was injured by a mine while traveling in an unknown mined area. Two civilian males were injured by mines while farming and 2 men and 1 woman were injured in the explosion (Chong kal commune).

In Angkor Chum district, 1 soldier was injured by a mine while patrolling and 5 soldiers were injured in the explosion (Sre Kvay commune).

In Banteay Srey district, 1 soldier was killed by a mine while traveling in an unknown mined area and 3 soldiers were injured in the explosion, 1 civilian male was killed and another injured in the explosion when a soldier stepped on a mine.

In Somrong district, 6 people were injured by mines: 1 soldier was injured while fighting in Koun Kreal commune, 2 soldiers were injured while fighting and another 2 were injured in the explosion in Bos Sbov commune, 1 soldier was injured while traveling in an unknown mined area in Koun Kreal commune.

In Angkor Thom district, 5 people were injured by mines (including 3 children): 1 soldier was killed and one was injured in the explosion while traveling in an unknown mined area.

In Chikreng district, 5 people were injured by mines: 1 civilian male was injured while traveling in an unknown mined area, 1 soldier was injured while traveling in an unknown mined area, 1 civilian female was killed while traveling in an unknown mined area and 2 men were injured in the explosion .

civilian female was killed while traveling in an unknown mined area and 2 men were injured in the explosion .

In Srey Snam district, 2 soldiers were injured by mines: 1 was killed while demining and one was injured in the explosion.

In Siem Reap district, 2 people were injured by UXO: 1 civilian male was injured while playing with an item of explosive ordnance and one man injured in the explosion in Siem Reap commune.

In Kralanh district, 1 man was injured while playing with an item of UXO in Sombou commune.

In Pouk district, 1 man was injured by a mine while traveling in an unknown mined area in Muk Pen commune.

In Southnikum district, 1 soldier was injured while demining and 1 civilian male was injured while playing with an item of UXO.

LONG TERM MINE VICTIM

This month 8 of the 54 injured are considered long term mine victims.

Of the 9 casualties in this category, 6 were soldiers who sustained the following injuries:

- 2 Below Knee Amputations
- 2 Above Knee Amputations
- 2 Below Elbow Amputations

3 civilian males sustained the following injuries:

- 1 Below Knee Amputation
- 1 Below Elbow Amputation
- 1 Blinded in L eye

In April 1996, 18 casualties have not been included in the monthly mine accident report. We have received this information in May as the data-gathering team could not access Samrong district for security reasons in April 1996.

In Samrong district, 9 people out of 18 were soldiers, 6 were civilian males and 2 were civilian females. One child was injured too.

In Samrong commune, 4 soldiers were injured by mines: one was injured while farming and 3 soldiers were injured while fighting.

In Bos Sbov commune 3 soldiers were injured by mines while fighting.

In Koun Kreal commune 10 people were injured: 2 civilian males and 2 soldiers were injured while fighting, 2 civilian males were killed and 1 man was injured while traveling in an unknown mined area and 1 was injured by a mine while cutting wood. 2 civilians female were injured: 1 was killed and one was injured while traveling in an unknown mined area.

In Chong Kal district, 1 child was injured by a mine while fishing.

7 people were considered long term mine victims.

2 soldiers suffered 1 Below Knee Amputation and 1 Below Elbow Amputation to L Hand and 5 civilians sustained the following injuries :

- 3 Below Elbow Amputation
- 1 Above Knee Amputation to R Leg
- 1 Below Knee Amputation to L Leg

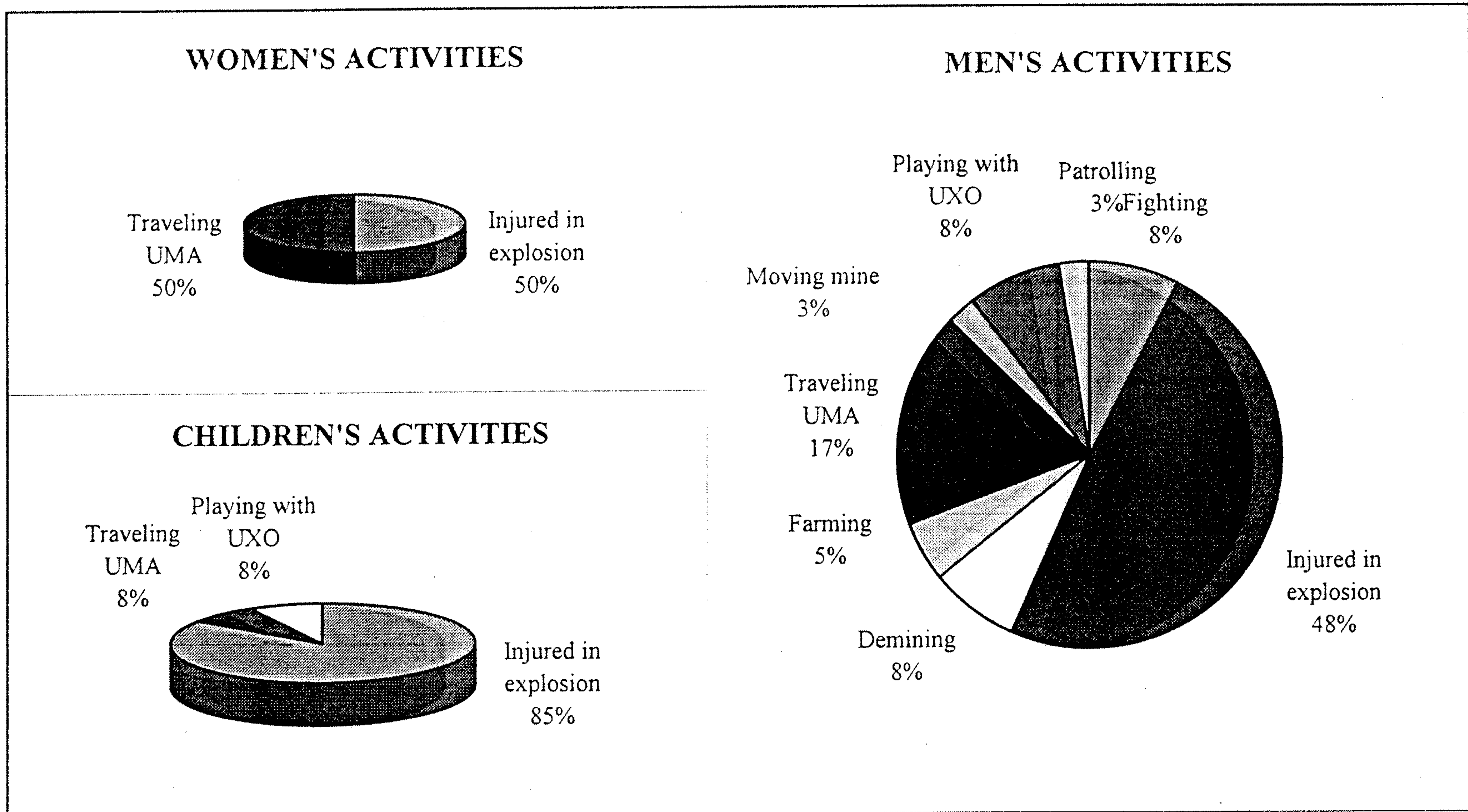

MAY 1996

BANTEAY MEANCHEY PROVINCE

In May 1996, 44 people were injured by mines and UXO. This figure includes 10 children (23 %). A total of 11 persons (24.9 %) of the 44 people injured died as a result of their injuries. This month 34 % of the total number of casualties were soldiers, 66 % were civilians (7 % of these were adult civilian females).

Details of the 10 children injured are as follows:

- In O Chrao district, 6 children were injured by mines and UXO: in Nimith commune, 1 boy was injured while moving a mine and another one was killed while collecting food. In Somrong commune, 1 boy was injured while moving an item of UXO and 2 other boys were injured in the explosion. In Kutha Ssorth commune, 1 boy was injured by a mine while herding cows.
- In Thmor Pouk district, 1 boy was killed by a mine while collecting food and another boy was injured in the explosion (in Kouk Romeath commune).
- In Svay Chek district, 1 boy was injured while walking close to a woman who stepped on a mine (in Phkom commune).
- In Serey Sophon district, 1 boy was injured while moving an item of UXO in Kompong Svay commune.

This month the majority of accident took place in O Chrao and Svay Chek districts:

In O Chrao district, 20 persons were injured by mines and UXO (this figure includes 6 children). 11 persons were injured by mines in Poi Pet commune: 1 soldier was killed, 1 was injured while fighting and another one died in the explosion. One soldier was killed while patrolling and 2 were injured while traveling in a newly mined area, another soldier was injured while traveling in an unknown mined area.

4 civilian males were injured: 1 was injured while traveling in a newly mined area, 1 was injured while cutting thatch, 1 was injured while collecting food and the other one was killed while cutting wood.

In Nimith commune, 2 civilian males were injured by mines: 1 was injured while fishing and the other was injured while sitting close to a young boy who was handling a mine. In Kouk commune, 1 civilian female, (a pregnant woman) was killed by a mine while collecting food.

In Svay Chek district, 10 persons were injured by mines and UXO (this figure includes 1 child). 6 persons were injured in Phkom commune. 4 civilian males were injured by mines: 1 was injured while cutting wood, 1 was injured while moving a mine, 1 was killed while collecting food and the other one was killed while herding livestock. One soldier was killed while moving a mine and one civilian female was injured by a mine while traveling in a newly mined area. In Sarong commune, 2 persons were injured by mines and UXO: 1 soldier was injured by a mine while fighting and one civilian male was injured when he initiated the explosion of an item of UXO while digging. In Treas commune, 1 man was injured while burning a UXO.

In Thmor Pouk district, 5 persons were injured by mines (this figure includes 2 children). In Kouk Romeath commune, 3 civilian males were injured while walking near a boy who stepped on a mine.

In Phnom Srock district, 4 persons were injured by mines and UXO. 3 soldiers were injured: one was injured while moving an item of UXO, the remaining 2 were injured in the explosion (Spean Sreng commune). One civilian male was injured by a mine while traveling in a newly mined area in Nam Tao commune .

In Ampil district, 2 soldiers were injured: 1 was injured while moving a mine and one was injured in the explosion.

In Mong Kulborey district, 1 soldier was injured while moving an item of UXO in Borth Throng commune.

In Preasnet Preash district, 1 civilian female was killed by a mine while traveling in a newly mined area in Chob Vary commune .

LONG TERM MINE VICTIMS

This month 12 of the 44 persons injured are considered "long term mine victims".

Of the 12 casualties in this category, 5 were soldiers who sustained the following injuries:

- 1 double Below Knee Amputation
- 1 Above Knee Amputation
- 1 Below Elbow Amputation
- 1 Blind R eye and 2 fingers amputated (to L hand)
- 1 Amputation of 3 fingers (R hand)

6 civilian males sustained the following injuries:

- 4 Below Knee Amputations
- 1 Above Knee Amputation
- 1 Blind L eye

1 child was blinded L eye

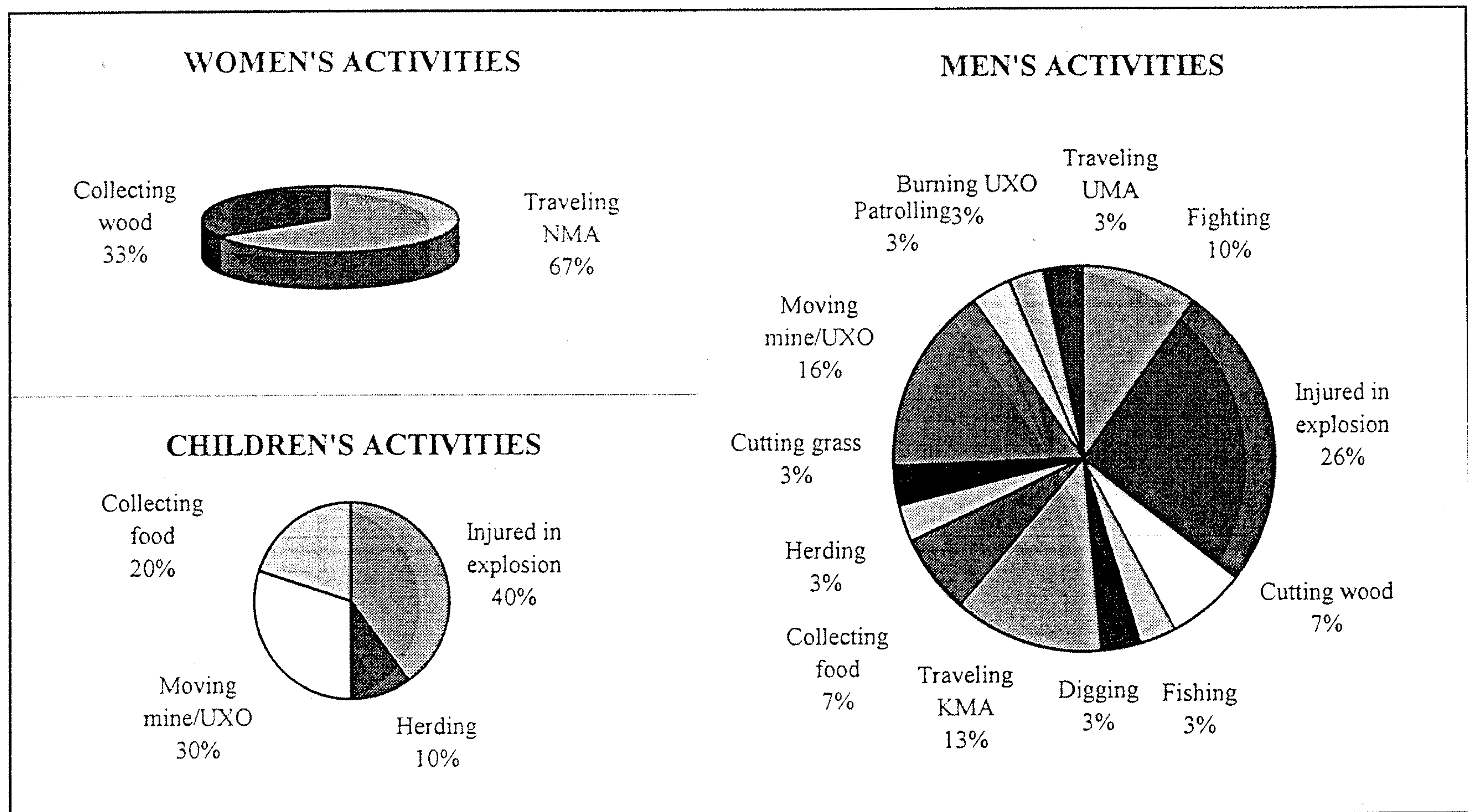

PUR SAT PROVINCE

In May 1996, 29 people were injured by mines and UXO. This figure includes 1 child. A total of 4 persons (14 %) of the 29 people injured died as a result of their injuries. This month, of the total number of casualties 38 % were military personnel, 62 % were civilian (3 % of whom were adult civilian females).

This month 1 boy was killed by a mine while ploughing in Pteas Rong commune, Phnom Kravanh district.

The majority of accidents took place in Phnom Kravanh district:

In Phnom Kravanh district, 27 people were injured by mines (11 soldiers, 15 civilian males, including one boy).

In Som Rong commune, 14 persons were injured by mines. 10 persons were soldiers: 1 was injured while extracting the explosive content from a mine, 1 person was killed and 8 others injured when a mine exploded while they were traveling in a known mined area.

One civilian male was injured while traveling in an unknown mined area and 3 others were injured in the explosion.

In Rokath commune, 1 man was injured by a mine while digging.

In Santre commune, 1 soldier was killed by a mine while traveling in a known mined area.

In Pteas Rong commune, 9 persons were injured by mines (including 1 boy): 1 civilian male was injured by a mine while traveling in an unknown mined area and 7 others were injured in the explosion.

In Prongil commune, 1 civilian male was killed by a mine while traveling in an unknown mined area and another one was injured in the explosion.

In Bakan district, 1 civilian female was injured by a mine while ploughing and 1 man was injured in the explosion (Svay Donkoe commune).

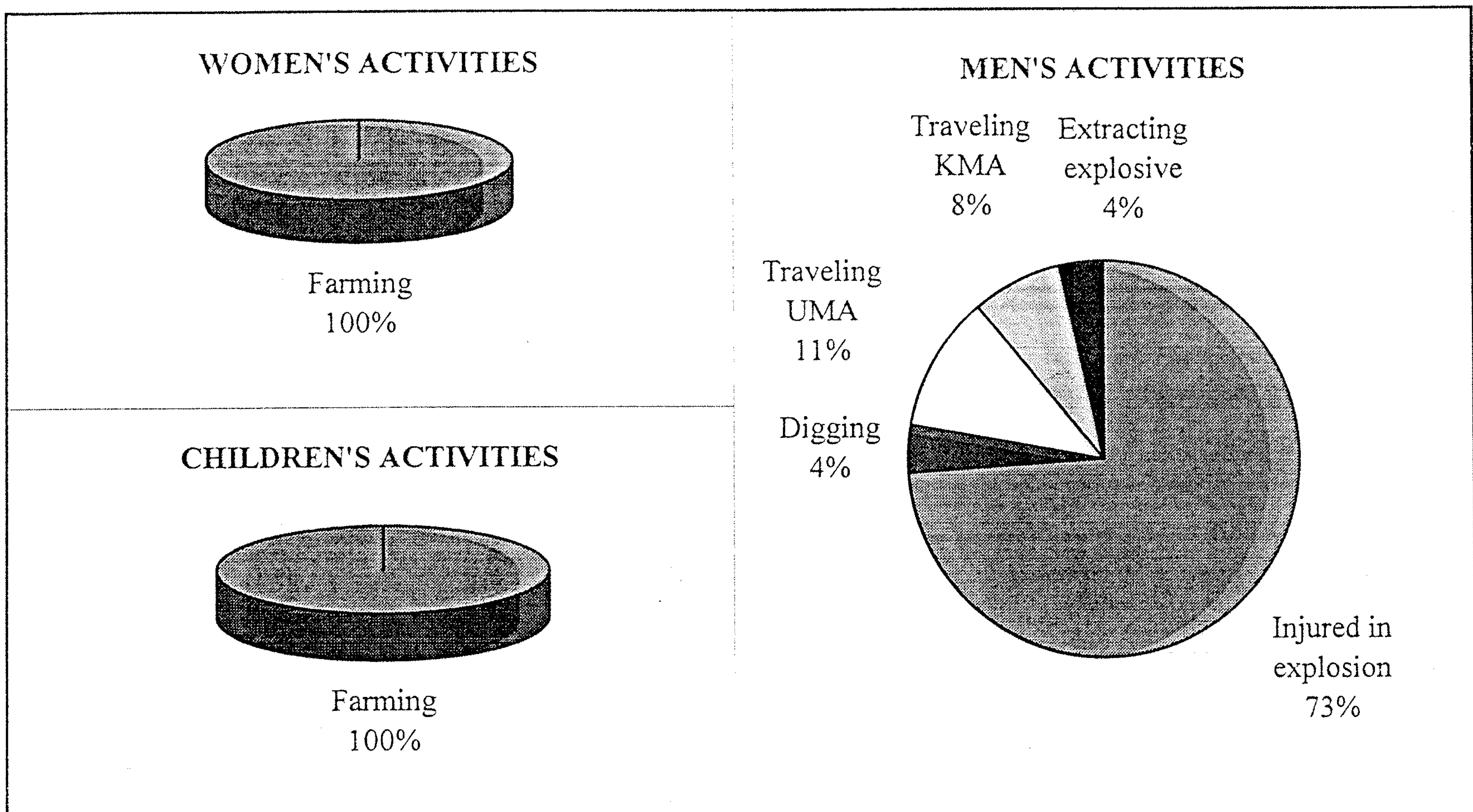

BATTAMBANG PROVINCE

In May 1996, 73 people were injured by mines and UXO. This figure includes 6 children (8 %). A total of 5 persons (7 %) of the 73 people injured died as a result of their injuries. This month 70 % of the total number of casualties were soldiers, 30 % were civilians (3 % of these were adult civilian females).

Details of the 6 children injured are as follows:

In Bavel district, 2 children were injured by mines in Bovel commune while herding.

In Rattanak Mondol district, 3 children were injured by mines (including 2 young soldiers): 1 boy was injured while cutting wood in Kilo 38 village, Treng commune, 1 young soldier was injured while patrolling in Phnom Koundomrey (Treng commune), one young soldier was injured while patrolling in Boeng Ampil village, Phlow Meas commune.

In Battambang district, 1 boy was injured by a mine while fishing.

The majority of accidents this month took place in Rattanak Mondol and Banan districts:

In Rattanak Mondol district, 52 persons were injured by mines. 49 casualties were soldiers (including 2 under the age of 18): 36 soldiers were injured by landmines while patrolling in Srong Thom mountain, 1 soldier was injured when an anti tank mine exploded as he was traveling to Pailin to fight the Khmer Rouge and another 2 soldiers were injured in the explosion, 1 soldier was injured by a mine and another one was injured in the explosion while patrolling, 1 soldier was killed and 2 others were injured while fighting, 1 soldier was killed while patrolling, 1 soldier was injured and another soldier injured in the explosion while patrolling. 3 civilians (including 1 boy) were injured: 1 man was injured by a mine in Chiseng village, Treng commune while cutting wood and 1 man was injured by a mine while traveling in a newly mined area in Sdao commune.

In Banan district, 10 people were injured by mines. Two of the 10 casualties were soldiers: 1 soldier was injured while demining in Kanteu I commune and 1 soldier was injured while patrolling. The remaining 8 casualties were adult civilian males: in Sneong commune, 1 man was killed when a newly-laid mine exploded on a river bank, one man died and another was injured in the incident (the men had been fishing), 1 man was injured while farming, 1 was injured while cutting wood. In Cheng Meanchey commune, 1 man was killed while traveling in a newly mined area. In Takriem commune, 1 man was injured by a mine while cutting wood and 1 was injured while traveling in a newly mined area.

In Bavel district, 6 persons were injured by mines and UXO. Two of the casualties were soldiers: 1 soldier was injured by a mine in Kdol Taken commune while extracting the explosive content from a mine and one soldier was injured by a mine while hunting in Prey Kpous commune. 4 civilians (including 2 boys) were injured: 1 man was injured by an item of UXO while farming in Lovea commune, 1 man was injured by a mine while traveling in a newly mined area in Knarch Romeas commune.

In Mong Russey district, 3 civilians were injured by mines: 1 man was injured when he drove his oxcart over a mine and two women were injured in the explosion in Prey Svay commune.

In Battambang district, 2 civilians were injured by mines (including 1 boy): a boy stepped on a mine and a man was injured in the explosion (Tapong commune).

LONG TERM MINE VICTIMS

This month 20 of the 73 injured are considered long term mine victims.

Of the 20 casualties in this category, 14 were soldiers who sustained the following injuries:

- 9 Below Knee Amputations
- 3 Above Knee Amputations
- 2 Below Elbow Amputations

4 civilian males sustained the following injuries:

- 3 Below Knee Amputation
- 1 Above Knee Amputation

2 children suffered Below Knee Amputations.

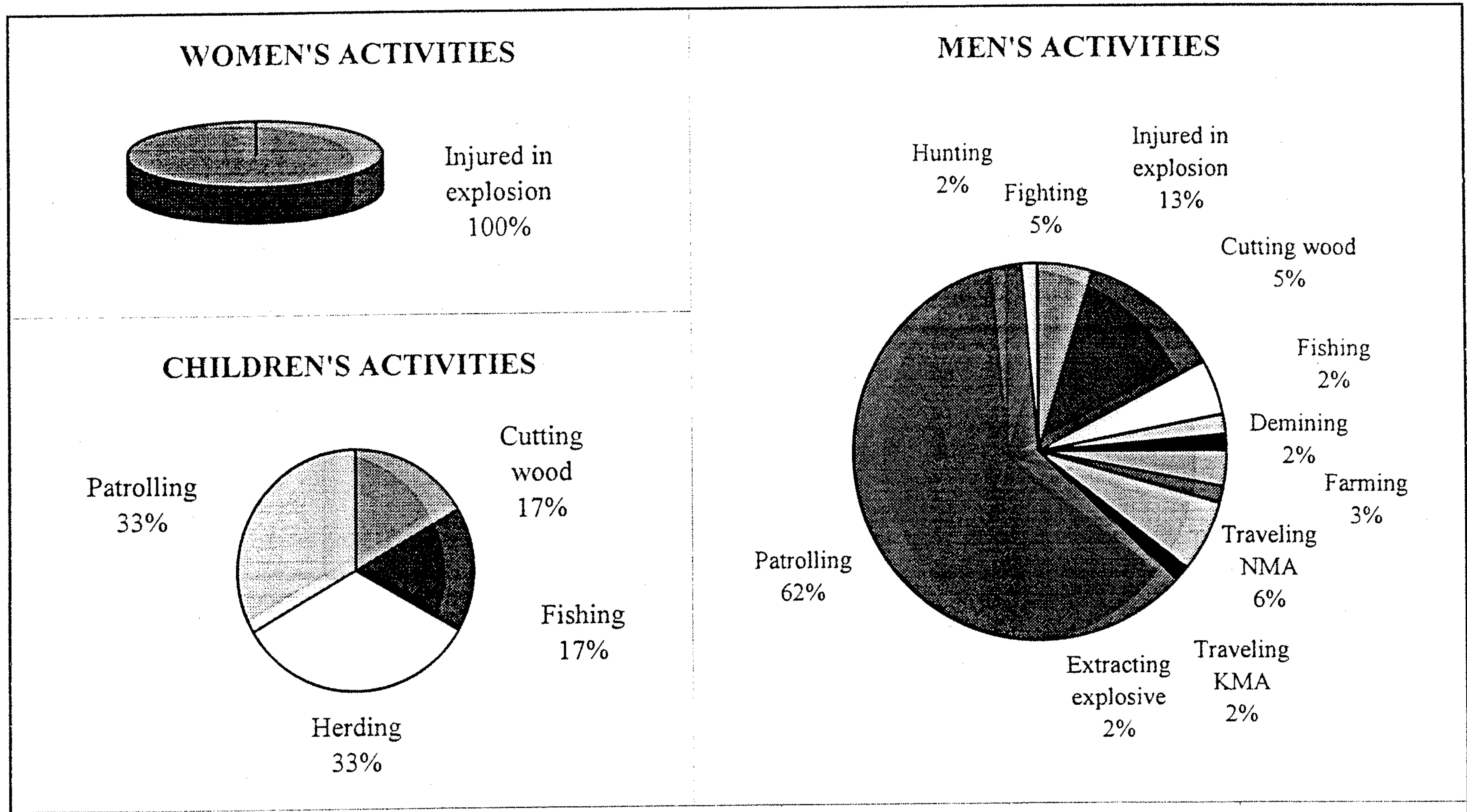

MONTHLY MINE/UXO ACCIDENT REPORT
MAY 1996
KOMPONG THOM PROVINCE

In May 1996, 33 persons were injured by mines and UXO. This figure includes 1 child (young soldier). A total of 7 people (21 %) of the 33 people injured died as a result of their injuries. This month 72.7 % (or 24 persons) of the total number of casualties were soldiers, 27.3 % (or 9 persons) were civilians (no adult females were injured this month).

This month the majority of accidents took place in Stung and Prasath Balaing districts:

- **In Prasat Balaing district, 28 people were injured by mines.**

Two civilians were injured while cutting wood. One of whom later died as a result of his injuries.

Two men were injured while ploughing (one in the West of Toul Kroel commune, one in the North West of Salavisay commune).

One person was injured while cutting grass (Toul Kroel commune).

One person was killed and another injured while traveling along the road to the ricefields.

One person was injured while farming in Salavisay commune.

Five soldiers were injured and one killed while traveling on road #12, North of Prasath Balaing district.

11 soldiers were injured, 4 of whom died as a result of their injuries, while patrolling on road # 12 from Preah Vihear to Prasath Balaing district (Ou Pou area).

Three soldiers were injured in the same area (Ou Pou) while fighting.

- **In Stung district, 5 soldiers were injured by mines:**

4 soldiers were injured while fighting in the Northwest of Stung district (Pou Pouk commune).

One soldier was injured while fighting in Trea commune.

“LONG TERM MINE VICTIMS”

This month 1 civilian was identified as a “ long term mine victim”. He lost both eyes.

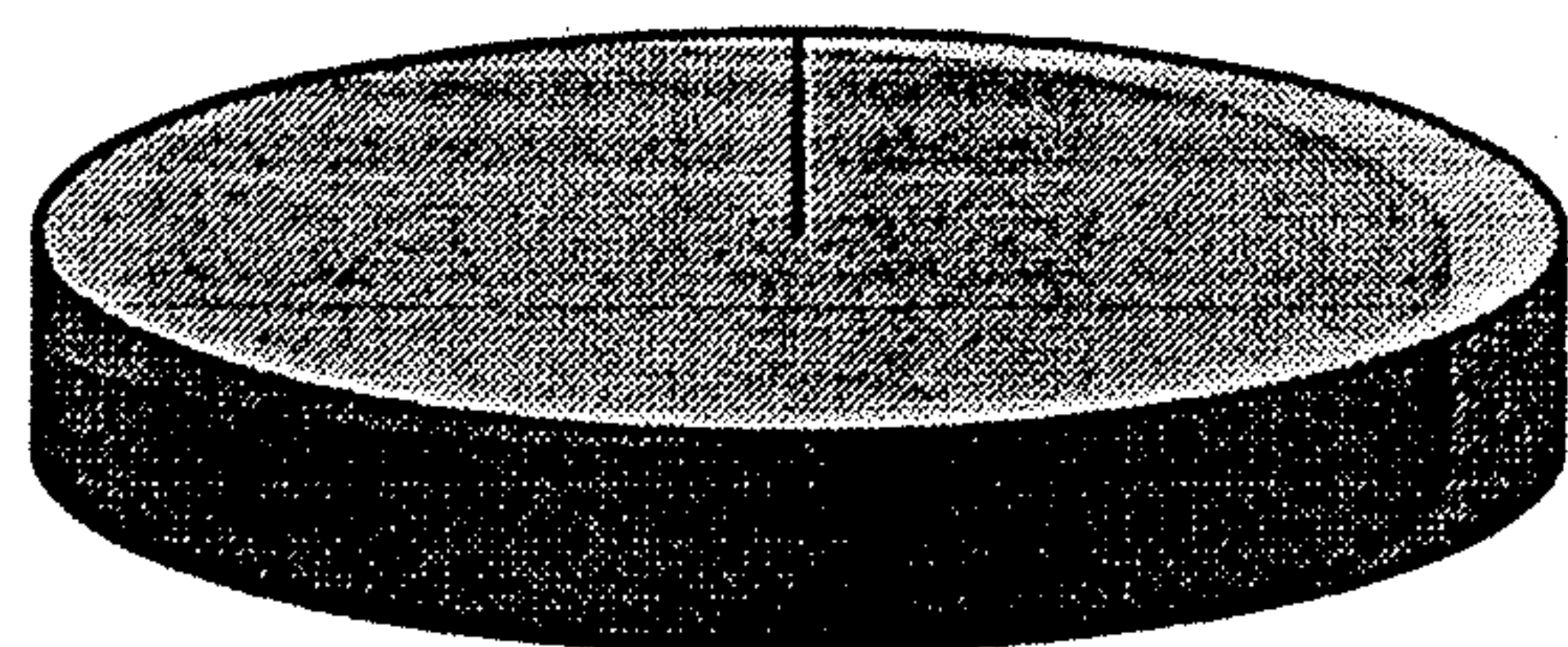

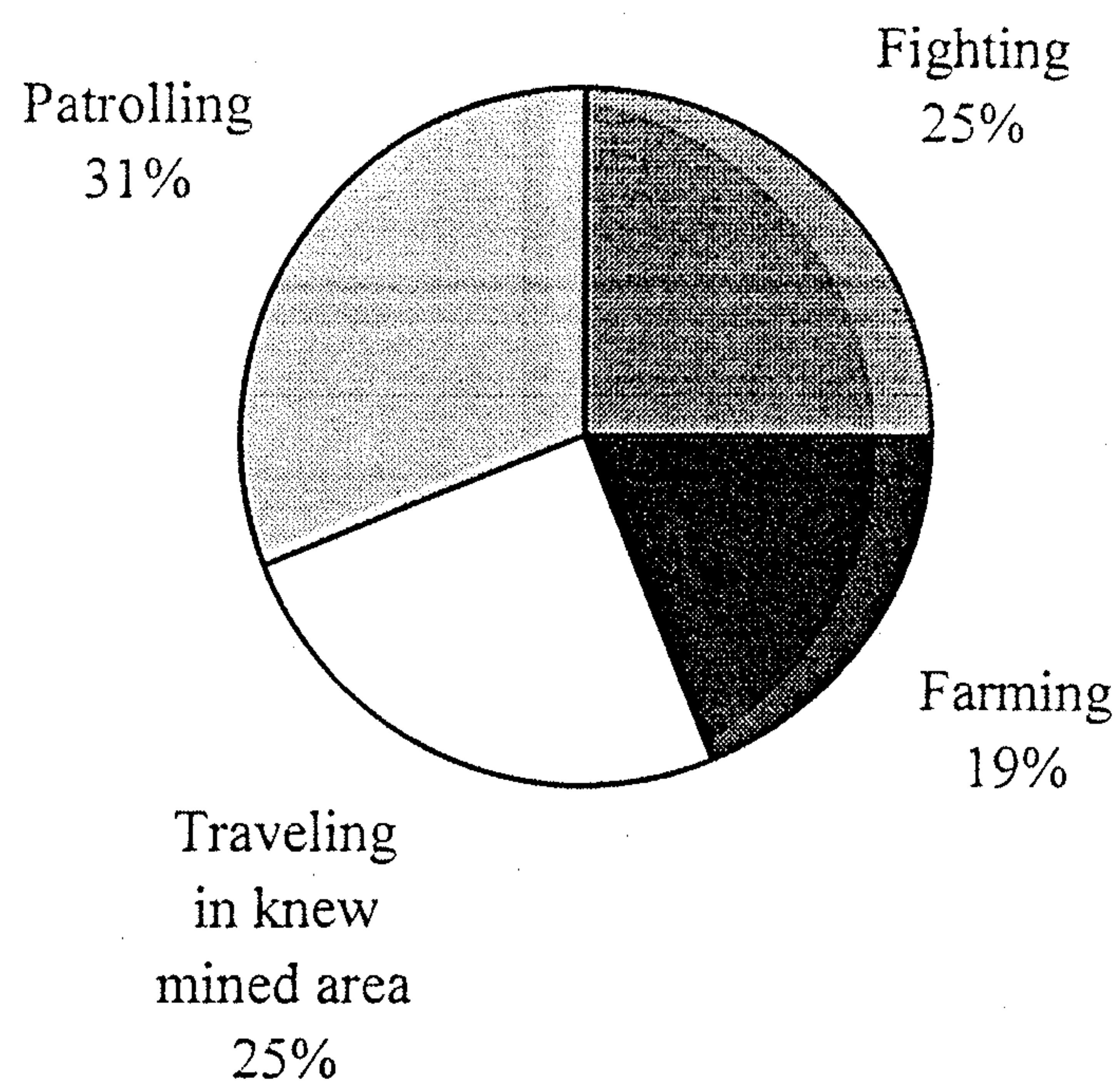
