Subject: Intelligence Analysis No. 0122 on the Possibility of Attack Against USULUTAN and Neighboring Towns.

1. SITUATION/INFORMATION

a. 22 June 83- About 200 T. have located in canton and project LA CEIBA (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c) SAN AGUSTIN/J, USULUTAN

b. 22 June-T. disseminated propaganda inside USULUTAN city

c. 22 June-Approximately 1,000 T. coming from SAN VICENTE Dept. moved toward canton and project SN LORENZO (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c) BERLIN/J; then they moved toward LA CEIBA farm SAN AGUSTIN/J (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c)

d. 24 June-About 500 T. located in the following places- :A GLORIA farm (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c) LAS CONCHAS farm (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c) and LOS ARENALES SAN AGUSTIN/J, USULUTAN. (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c)

e. 26 June-Captured T. declared that 400 T. are moving from MORAZAN to EL JICARO, USULUTAN/J.

f. 26 June-Undetermined number of T. moved from camps located above SAN AGUSTIN toward SAN FRANCISCO JAVIER, USULUTAN.

g. 26 June-T. supplying themselves in the town of SAN AGUSTIN, USULUTAN.

h. 28 June-Undetermined number of T. moved from MORAZAN toward USULUTAN, establishing themselves near SAN AGUSTIN and EL CARMEN. (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c)

i. 23 June-Undetermined number of T. have moved from CERROS DE SAN PEDRO, following this route; from canton and project SAN PEDRO (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c) toward canton and project SAN FELIPE (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c) towards LAS BRISAS (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c) passing through Hacienda MECHOTIQUE (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c) toward canton and project EL TIGRE (b)(1); Sec. 1.4(b); Sec. 1.4(c) SANTIAGO DE MARIA/J.

2. CONCLUSIONS

a. It is clear that the T. in the area of SAN VICENTE are fleeing from the zone in an attempt to avoid combat due to Operation "WELL BEING for SAN VICENTE".

b. The T. in their zeal to alleviate the pressure of the army on SAN VICENTE, has tried to carry out harassment and attacks against towns where they hve deployed.

c. Because of the considerable number deployed and the places towards which they have moved, there is a possibility of harassment and attack against the following towns:

SANTIAGO DE MARIA
SAN FRANCISCO JAVIER
SAN AGUSTIN
TECAPAN
CALIFORNIA
JIQUILISCO
PUERTO EL TRIUNFO
BERLIN
MERCEDES UMANA

d. According to what the T. have shown in their zeal to continue with the total destruction of the National Economy, there is the possibility that the deployment toward USULUTAN is being used to sabotage the planting and cultivation of cotton.

e. It is clear that the danger of attacks against security personnel at the FENADESAL and CUSCATLAN bridges persists, and as consequence the possible destruction of these bridges as well as the SAN LORENZO dam.

3. R E C O M M E N D A T I O N S

a. That the Mil Div 4 coordinate with the Senior Commander of the Well-Being for SAN VICENTE operation with the aim of preventing the enemy from locating in the general area of USULUTAN.

b. That the Mil Div 4 plan an operation anticipating that of the enemy to be coordinated with the 3 and 6th Infantry Brigades, CICFA, and the Navy and directed at restricting the T. escape routes.
