BAGHDAD IN BYGONE DAYS.

Appointed Resident Baghdad. 16th Jan. 1808

Mr. Munro - East India Co. Resident at Basra.

Mr. Hine, Surgeon & Acting Resident.

One European lady - a Mrs. Peronoid the English wife
of a Dutchman.

1809 spring Mr. Adair British Ambassador at Constantinople

1809 - (P. 45) Ceremony of the Public Audience of the
Resident.

1808 Two British Envoys sent simultaneously to Persia
- Cabot in 1808 - Governor General of India Lord Minto
both anxious.

Sir Hester Jones who had been the first Brit. Resident
of B'had in 1797 + appointed H. H. Envoys to the Shah

Nomination upheld by the Directors of the E. India Co.

1808 Feb. 1 Bengal sent General orders Sir John Malcolm

July 1808 Wahabi - Tech Hillah

Summer 1809 Friction between Rust & Suleiman Pasha.

Apr 1810 Rich's position strengthened - acknowledged by the Pasha as Balo

Jauid - a small troop of Hussar's old European - 75 men and a sergeant - Russians, Slavs, some Eng. men.

Maitre d'Hotel - a Slav ^{for understanding} who could speak Italian & Turkish.

1810 Made Resident for the whole Pashalik -

Manesty came to B'ded with his wife & family

Dr. Adgukov just of assistant at Bessich & Mr. Hise remained at B'ded. (Mr. Hise is friend of Manesty's Sir H. Jones)

1810 Arrival of Ben's Effendi to raise money - returned to Mosul former deputy of the Pasha.

1810 General Makedon & his staff appeared in B'ded at latter hour - ^{at} ~~the~~ camp.

B in journal. - Pascha betrayed in flight to Basrah. (3)
P. 73 (Description of life in summer camp)
Macedon left one of his officers to command the baggage train.
Mr. Fredericks - stayed 6 months. after departure of Macedon
for India in 1810.

Nov & Dec. 1810 B'dad in disturbed state.

Various men passing thro' Baghdad - Mr. Macdonald
disguised as an Arab set off for Aleppo. attacked returned to B'dad.
later to Govt. in 3 weeks.

P. 79. Letter to Sir James Mackintosh giving advice on journey
from Basrah to B'dad.

1811 Sir John Cusack appointed ^{Minister} Ambassador to Persia -
chance for Katherine Mackintosh to visit her sister
A. Khatibi Akh - a traveller staying at the Residency
educated in Italy - spoke Italian always.

P. 94. Discussion of Baghdad Residency - compared
with commercial Residency of Basrah.

Dec, 1811 - Babylon - Harj. Mich, Kelly Mackintosh,
The Resident, Dr. Hise & Messrs. Boulton & Beckett (?)

The Mission used for surveying purposes - Moore an Eng. man expert with the sighting & levelling instruments & understood the chain & tape measures.

Mr. B. Beauchamp had travelled to Bagdad 22 yrs. previously.

Mr. Lechitt had travelled in Persia

Mr. Canning a missionary to Persia - accompanied Sir William Wuseman to B'bad - married to Kitty Jan. 1812.

Visit of Mother of one of late Pasha's sons. (P. 110)

1812 Rihs - accounts of early Nestor. Stantepis journey through Syria (about 46)
P. 116 persecutions against the Rihs (no Protons as slaves - no harbouring of deserters from Brit. ships)

Oct. 1813 the Rihs left B'bad. leaving Mr. Hine as acting Assistant.

Month P. 124 - Description of Mosul - host the Dominican Father J. Weyler - Father Raffaelli.

Mardin. P. 127 stayed at Armenian Catholic Arch-bishop's house.

Diarbekr (P. 131) rode straight to the house of Monsignor Agostino Hindi, Patriarch of the Chaldees & Apostolic Legate of Rome.

At Diarbekir - Kojeh Jegerie the coffee agent.

Malatia - P. 137. Rich asked to excuse a public entry.
Reception by Baba Pasha.

P. 141 Tebrat - stayed at house of an Armenian Catholic -
stone to be put on the grave of HENRY MARTYN - one of the
first Eng. missionaries in Asia Minor. (had died in 1812)
- correspondence with Rich - had wanted to enter Persia
through Baghdad territory.

Ismid - met Mr. Calavro - fourth dragoman to Brit. Embassy.
arrived with invitations for the

Jan. 1814 Arrived in Constantinople

While in Turkey, correspondence with Lady Hester Stanhope.

P. 199 Venice - visited Island of San Lorenzo - An. -
monastic institution to establish an Armenian press - books & translations
for enlightenment & culture of their Brethren in Asia Minor.

P. 201 Trieste joined by Mr. Bellini a young German whom Ulanovitch
had met in Vienna & to whom he offered a post as a
secretary. 1815 Sailed 28th July.

Leffe - met Mr. Remond (treasurer of the island) last met 3 yrs.
before in B'dad.

1815-16 last. - Baghdad. 24th Nov. Claudio & Mari - Mr. Bellino's
Pietro, maître d'hôtel, Charles (Hungarian valet) Armenian groom, two
Tatar couriers & their servant.

The etiquette of the couriers (P. 215)

Village of Boyer before arriving at Tikat - mounds made of handfuls
of earth thrown by soldiers of Sultan Husayn en journey to & from Baghdad
A ~~Armenian~~ Archbishop of Maridin Messingia Gioacchino Tulas
Rich made British Agent for Meschin.

Caravan resting on edge of desert. (P. 232) - Pasha of Mosul
had sent an officer to attend them. In Mosul - quarters in the
Dominican Hospice.

End of March - arrival of Mr. Stone.

P. 236. Journey by 'kellehi'

1816 Arrival in B'd. - In Bombay Sir Evan Nepean, Sec. of Bom Bay.
Mr. G. Lyndstone, - & Mr. Warden, Sec. to the Genl.

In July Mr. Grant (the Director) & General Maledon 1810 - Rich
July 1816, Rich received a new title, that of Agent for Turkish Arabia,
having the Bassa Agency under him with an assistant.

Raymond - sergeant in 3. India Cav. Regiment of Artillery - despatched to
 B'had - French Consul - seized one of merchants of Austria's remission;
 Fr. advised a better representative more suitable at B'had.
 Basin de Vigoroux arrived. Raymond to Basia
 1819 Jan - March - trouble with Basha Sid & brother - in law
 Douad & Khadi.

Mr. Charles Bellini - private secretary;
 1816 summer traveller James Seth Beckenham

1818 important border warfare continued between Turkey & Persia -
 trouble in Kurdistan & intrigues at Mosul - Prince of Kermanshah had
 an eye on Baghdad.

End of 1818 - new houses on banks of Tigris -
 November. a visit to Sir Robert Ker Porter -

Sept. 1818 Dr. Colquhoun applied for sick leave - Capt. Taylor
 of 3rd. Bombay Native Infantry as Assistant at Basia to
 him.

journey into Kurdistan 1820 - towards end of April -
 with Major Bellini - Dr. Morando & Seid Aga, the Persian Secretary
 Agostinas. First Dragoman commanded the Sipsy guards.

1820 (P. 266) encamped outside Sulimania until Mahmud Pasha could make preparations for their entry.

Tostan arrived from B'lad with news of death of K. George III

May 10th. - public entry & reception into Sulimania.

Description of house assigned to Rich in S. (P. 269)

Life in Sulimania - Major's friendship with the wife of the Pasha.

8th June 1820 - joined by Mr. Bell, surgeon appointed in place of Mr. King.

Tarikh el Akhbar - History of Kurchistan (P. 277)

(Dead)

1820-21 At Mosul, Pasha of B'lad forbade Rich to re-enter.

20th Nov. 1820 death of Bellino.

Yezidi - P. 289 "Under British rule much might be made of these people."

14th March 1821 Staying at Residency - Capt. Elliott,

Capt. Tyla, Mr. Haste, surgeon - Mr. Bell.

13th June 1821 The Pasha left Bassai - Bushiri

where the E. India Co. owned a factory, presided over by an Agent.
