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Program Note

"This is the story of two women, Vanessa and Erika, caught in the central dilemma which faces every human being: whether to fight for one's ideals to the point of shutting oneself off from reality, or compromise with what life has to offer, even lying to oneself for the mere sake of living"
—G. C. Menotti

As young Erika watches an early winter storm, her aunt, the beautiful but aging Vanessa, waits for her lover, as she has been waiting every day for the past twenty years. A young man appears at the door. Without even looking at him, Vanessa addresses him as "Anatole." And so begins a gothic romance of an aunt and niece in love with the same young man.

When Barber's *Vanessa* premiered at New York's Metropolitan Opera House in January 1958, *The New York Times* called it "the best American opera ever presented" and *The New Yorker* praised Barber as "a real master of the operatic tradition." That same year *Vanessa* won the Pulitzer Prize for composition and was produced at the Salzburg Festival.

This great American opera has been praised by aficionados as much for its libretto as for its beautiful score. Menotti (*Amahl and His Night Visitors*) has produced one of his best libretti for *Vanessa*. In the disquieted Vanessa, her vulnerable niece Erika, her stern mother, the Baroness (Erika's grandmother) and other protagonists, Menotti has portrayed fine, three-dimensional characters, drawn with a wry sense of humor.
