### **Training Programme By United Kingdom's National High Tech Crime Unit (NHTCU)**

The United Kingdom's National High Tech Crime Unit Officers (NHTCU) will conduct a training programme of SurfControl Chat Monitor to police of the Department of Anti-Human Trafficking and Minors Protection at the Ministry of Interior.

The training will assist in the monitoring of paedophile activity on the Internet. The training is expected to lead to a reduction in people trafficking and paedophilia-related crimes in Cambodia.

The course will be conducted from 02 to 05 February 2004 by two trainers from the UK at the Department of Anti-Human Trafficking and Minors Protection. The NHTCU will donate a computer to the Department of Anti-Human Trafficking and Minors Protection during the training programme. It is hoped that police officers will use the computer to monitor and subsequently arrest paedophiles on the Internet in Cambodia.

#### **Notes to Editors:**

This training programme is following the previous one in October 2002, during which another computer with the Internet monitoring software was donated to the Anti-Human Trafficking and Minors Protection Department at the Ministry of Interior.

The NHTCU also conducted similar courses in India and Sri Lanka in January 2004.
