

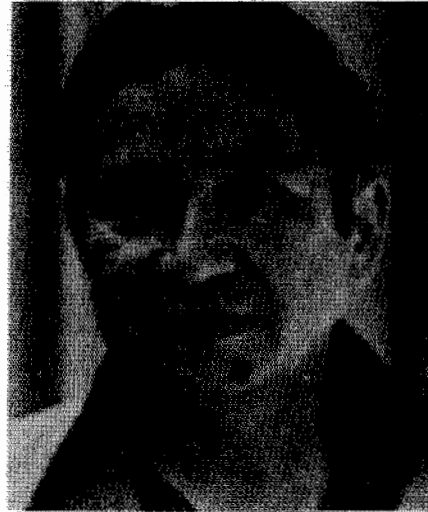

Col. José García is one of the most popular and intelligent officers in the Salvadoran Army and has a reputation for integrity. A moderate, he was considered by the military as a possible successor to President Arturo Molina in 1977; in the long run, however, they decided on Carlos Romero, who was the successful candidate in an election [redacted]

[redacted] Throughout the summer and early fall of 1979 García may have been involved in several plots to overthrow Romero [redacted]

[redacted] he was commander of the Department of San Vicente, a position he had held since July 1978. [redacted]

García is anti-Communist and friendly toward the United States. [redacted] he is sympathetic toward the US human rights policy. Local politicians consider him one of the few officers who are seriously concerned about human rights in El Salvador; in the past he has used his influence to release illegally held prisoners. After enlisting in 1956, García rose rapidly through the ranks. He attended the War College in Mexico during 1966-70 and took an orientation tour of the Panama Canal Zone in 1963. During 1974-77 he was president of the National Telephone Company. García is married to the former Martha del Carmen Rodríguez and has four daughters. He will be 47 on 23 June. [redacted]
