III. SECURITY PLAN FOR THE HOUSE.

1. GENERAL SECURITY RULES

- a. The premises where the comrade lives must be legally rented, although the comrades providing the front need not keep legal employment.
- b. The comrades who live with her, the guarantor and renter must be carefully investigated.
- c. All of the comrades who live in the house must be part of a military squadron and they will be provided with the information and military instruction necessary, all of them incorporating themselves into the work of security for the comrade, with the exception of the old persons and children.

 - g. At any time that she may be going /appears to be slang expression for armed/, all the comrades who travel with her must carry arms and another comrade for security, with a submachine gun and two grenades. /handwritten:/ the driver and one security man /rather illegible/
2. FOR CONTACTS:
- a. A car should be maintained. For this, the comrade who has the driver duties (Carlos). Going to these contacts that should be only information or any handwritten instruction and thus avoid that the /female/ comrade be the one who has to go.
 - b. That the comrade only go out on working contacts.
 - c. That Comrade Carlos (driver) inform other comrades by mail.
 - d. When the comrade must attend a contact, Carlos must make a visual check on foot or in a vehicle and pick her up at the moment indicated.
 - e. Reaffirm that no routine is established for the contacts.
 - f. Not to utilize the same zone for making contacts.
 - g. Not to travel through zones of conflict: around military centers, markets, downtown, etc.
 - h. Always double-check when she is going by vehicle.
 - i. Go on foot as seldom as possible.
 - j. To travel look for zones where there are the fewest traffic lights.
 - k. /handwritten:/ couple of illeg. words/ leave her one block from where she is making the contact or from the house where she is going and /3 illeg. words/
